Q1 Thirty-five states make voting by mail available to all eligible voters. New York state does not. Would you support or oppose making vote by mail an option for all eligible voters in New York state?

Support 57%
Oppose 37%
Not sure 6%

Q2 During the pandemic, more than 1.7 million New Yorkers used a temporary vote-by-mail option to cast a ballot, but that option expired at the end of 2022. Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: New York should make vote by mail available to everyone whether there is a pandemic or not?

Agree 49%
Disagree 44%

Q3 During the pandemic, New York state made vote-by-mail a temporary option and participation increased, with 1.7 million voters using mail to vote in the 2020 election. Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: With the pandemic ending, New York should join 35 other states and make vote-by-mail a permanent option?

Q4 I'm going to give you some statements about vote-by-mail, and after each one, ask you if hearing that statement makes you more likely or less likely to support a permanent vote-by-mail option, or if it doesn't make a difference. Here's the first one: Studies estimate that waiting to vote in line costs more than \$544 million in lost wages, with the burdens falling on communities of color especially hard. New York should join 35 states around the country and make a vote-by-mail option available to all eligible voters, saving time and money. Does hearing this make you more likely or less likely to support a permanent vote-by-mail option, or does it not make a difference?
